

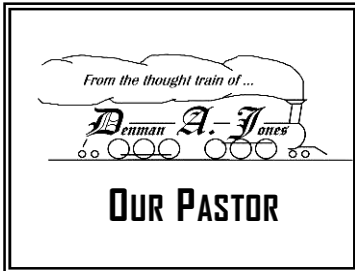

## Believe: Someone Greater is at Work

**A** young man fell hopelessly in love with a young lady. He walked around with that gushy, dazed look of being in love written all over his face. When he was asked about the girl, he described her beauty and personality, and then he concluded, "She just makes me fly inside".

What a wonderful phrase!

What is it that makes us "fly inside?" What are our passions in life? What are the things that we can't just not do? What fire had God lighted in our souls?

The difficult thing about passions is that you often have to go through "turbulent air" before you are able to fly. You have to be willing to take risks. And risks carry with them the possibility of loss, rejection, and failure. Yet when we take a risk—especially one that results from trusting God or being obedient to Him—we are given an incredible opportunity to grow.

Learning to fly is risky business. Crash landings usually hurt, and it's hard to get up, brush yourself off, and try again. Stepping out and doing what you were created to do rather than what is expected of you is hard. Even faith is a risk, so living a life of following Jesus is littered with risk.

Many people have mistakenly given up on their passion because life hasn't gone the way they expected or thought it should go. As a result, they have quenched the embers of passion within their hearts. Yet God invites us to take a risk and allow the embers to come back to life. Any step—even a small, incremental step—can allow your passion to reignite.

Be brave! Take a risk of faith! Let the passion of your life shine forth! Courage requires the belief that something greater than yourself is at stake. Also, it asks you to trust that Someone greater is at work. And as you pursue your passion, remember that wherever you go, God goes before you. And isn't a little risk worthwhile if it means you get to fly.

## The Habits of Quail

I was trying to concentrate, but somehow couldn't. The sermon was a little too soothing, and, instead of holding your attention, lulled you to sleep. I began to slip into a state of neutral resignation when suddenly a sharp, shrill sound cut through that dreamy reverie, and my attention jumped up and fled outside. For the next twenty minutes I listened to the sermon that was bring preached out there.

The sound came from a quail who was hidden somewhere close in a tall clump of grass or a palmetto patch. "Where are you?" "Where are you?" "Where are you?" he said. That's what a quail always says when he whistles. In fact, I think that's the only reason he whistles. Either the covey has been scattered, and he's trying to find the others, or, as in this case, it is mating season and he was calling to his mate. In either situation the questions is, "Where are you?"

He whistled for five minutes, ten, twenty, stopping at intervals to listen for a reply. "Where are you?" he called, and finally the answer came. "Over here! Over here!"

If you know the habits of quail you can visualize the drama that begins to take place. For a moment or two the call goes back and fourth to determine where the other is and then they begin running toward each other, stopping at intervals to call again.

Such was the case in the field outside the chapel where we were sitting, and I thought about God. The prophet said that God whistles (Isaiah 7:18). "Where are you? Where are you?" God says, and there is only silence. Again and again God calls and no one answers. Finally a reply is given, "Over here! Over here!"

Then each begins to proceed toward the other, pausing to say, "Where?" "Here!" "Where?" Here!" After some interval we make our way toward each other and the calls cease. We have met and found one another.

Our hope lies in the fact that God keeps calling to us over and over, calling and listening. Our salvation is in the reply: "Over here, over here," and then in making our way toward God, calling and listening. It is God's calling that makes us aware of God's presence; it is our response that brings us together.
